Awarding the Priory Principle Badges

	Pride	Take pride in yourself and your work.
The pupil consistently demonstrates pride in themselves and their work. The pupil wears correct school uniform daily and has had pieces of exceptional work submitted to the Head Teacher or Assistant Head Teacher.		
	Protect	Look after , appreciate and care for your school environment.
The pupil consistently appreciates the school environment and ensures they support others to look after the school. The pupil will ensure their work space is tidied and looked after. The pupil will help clean the classroom at the end of a lesson. The pupils will clear litter left on the ground. Pupils achieving the protect award are nominated by a teacher or teaching assistant.		
	Pleasant	Look after others and make everyone else's day brighter .
The pupil consistently cares for and supports others. They do their best to make others feel happy and special. The pupils has received five <i>Make Someone's Day Brighter</i> certificate.		
	Persevere	Always try your hardest and do your best.
The pupil consistently tries their hardest and perseveres with their work and friendships in school. The pupil consistently demonstrates a higher lesson score.		
	Proactive	If you have a problem ask for help .
The pupil understands they need support and knows when and how to ask for this support. They accept support from their peers and adults and are happy to help others when they can. Pupils achieving the proactive award are nominated by a teacher or teaching assistant.
